GENERAL APPEAL

With just over three weeks to go, we now need all our helpers and supporters to focus on this event. Do make sure that the date is firmly in your diary and that plants and produce are ready and waiting.

This event attracts people from far outside our villages, so we need to maintain our hard-earned reputation. For some 20 years the income from this event has been vital to the financial well-being of our two churches. We need to keep up the standards of previous years and send our customers home happy. This is a collective enterprise, with collective benefits.

PLANTS – we do urge you all look around your garden to see whether you can produce plants that we can sell: self-sown plants, seedlings, split clumps, cuttings, shrubs etc. It has been quite a protracted winter, but plants are now stirring and showing signs of early growth, so you can see what is what! We do need to continually identify fresh sources of plants. We will collect, if necessary – contact Norman Porter, otherwise deliveries of good, healthy plants will be gratefully received on *Friday 24th April at the Village hall between 2-00 and 6-00.* We do still have spare pots, by way of an incentive for you to do this. The pots can be delivered to your home.

Do please label all plants if you possibly can.

RAFFLE – this is again being run by Vicky Carr. Further offers of prizes will be gratefully received by her (620213). We have a special stand-alone raffle this year for an hour's flying experience in the skies over Bealings. This is additional to the usual raffle.

CARDBOARD BOXES – Do please collect these, as available, from stores, and deliver them to the Village Hall on the Friday –they are invaluable for people taking away large numbers of plants.

PRODUCE – Please let us have any produce (cakes, rhubarb, jams, chutneys etc.) for our cake/produce stall. This is usually the first stall to be sold out, so the more produce the better. Please deliver to the Village Hall on the Friday afternoon, or between 9.00 and 10.00 am on the Saturday, or deliver in person to Margaret Martin, Margaret Giblin.

We are also hoping that there will be a repeat of the Bealings Bake-Off Competition, which attracted such imaginative entries last year. Prizes will be awarded to cakes baked to a given theme – further details to follow.

GARDEN PARAPHERNALIA - Last year we managed to recycle or re-consign to happy homes a considerable number of gardening implements and accessories. We shall again be pleased to receive any such items for resale, including garden ornaments, gardening books and electrical items (sold as seen). If you have spare seeds, we can also sell those.

CAR PARKING — Our car parking team will be on duty, maximizing the space, and doing their best to ensure that most people can park close to the Hall. There will be spaces on and just off the drive leading to the Manor House, and a good number at the Village Hall, with priority being given to anyone with mobility problems. If you are collecting or delivering plants, please drive in and out around the turning circle. With the Pub still shut, we have to find somewhere else for Helpers to park, and urge them

to take advantage of the kind offer of the Ruffords at the Manor House to park there.

LUNCH - Once again a picnic lunch will be provided behind the village hall at round about 12.45. This keeps helpers on site, so we can get the site completely cleared by early afternoon. After the service refreshments were served. in abundance, at Playford Village Hall, providing a fittingly sociable end to the evening. Arrangements for the occasion were necessarily complex, but much facilitated by the readiness of so many people to play a part. Our thanks to all who from across the Benefice helped with car-parking, ushering and with the provision of refreshments. This was an occasion to remember, and it set the tone for what we very much hope will be a long and fulfilling ministry.

LOOKING BACK WENDY BROOK. IN MEMORIAM.

Wendy, died in late February, aged just 70, and the funeral took place on March 5th at St Marv's. Woodbridge, where she and David normally worshipped. Wendy was the victim of a particularly cruel and aggressive form of Motor Neurone Disease, and had only been diagnosed as suffering from this in November. She, formerly a nurse, and David, together with David's three sons. had originally moved from Mersea Hall in Essex to Great Bealings, where they converted three cottages into one substantial house. Together they shared many years of a passionate enjoyment of sailing, and also came to enjoy golf at Purdis.

David continues to live in Birdshill, on the way to Seckford Hall, and we offer him our most sincere condolences, as to his three sons.

PCC MEETINGS AND ANNUAL MEETING

A PCC meeting took place on Wednesday March 4th – the first with our new incumbent, who was warmly welcomed. It was agreed that individual Parish Annual Meetings should be held this year but that all 4 parishes would look for ways of streamlining meetings, both for the benefit of the incumbent, and also as a way of improving Benefice cohesion.

The Great Bealings Annual Meeting has now been arranged for Sunday April 19th, immediately after the Family Service. You are warmly encouraged to come along to both — coffee will be served in between the two. This will be an opportunity to hear about the events and achievements of the past year, as well as the occasion when elections take place for officers for the year to come.

CHURCH MAINTENANCE PROJECT

The contractors are now working on the north window, removing the loose masonry preparatory to consolidating the whole structure. The PCC agreed that there were probably sufficient funds to enable the whole of the nave to be decorated, subject to a satisfactory estimate. If we go ahead, the church will probably have to be closed for most of the month of May, to enable all internal decoration to be completed. This will inevitably impact upon services. Details of enforced changes will be fully publicised.

The meeting congratulated Charles Barrington on the efficient way in which he had managed and overseen the various stages of the work. All is proceeding satisfactorily, and within budget.

CHURCHYARD

The ground remains very uneven, so do please take care if you are visiting. The

rabbits continue to burrow both deeply and shallowly, and seem to have installed themselves within the churchyard, rather than intrude from outside. Action may be needed.

It was agreed at the PCC meeting that it would be useful if specific individuals took responsibility for sections of the churchyard over the year. We have two volunteers already. If you would be prepared to help in this respect and assume responsibility of a limited area, do please have a word with Norman Porter.

FRIENDS OF GREAT BEALINGS CHURCH CONCERT - THE BROOK STREET BAND 28TH FEBRUARY

Bealings Village Hall became the next best thing to a Leipzig coffee house when the Brook Street Band entertained a packed hall to an evening of baroque music played on traditional instruments. The programme consisted of sonatas by JS Bach and Georg Telemann, with a piece by Handel as an encore. The extremely talented musicians violinists. Rachel Harris and Farran Scott. cellist. Tattv Theo and Harpsichord player Carolyn Gibley not only played beautifully, they also entertained us with lively accounts of the complexities of adapting the music to create an interpretation of the music that would have been popular in 7immermann's Kaffeehaus the 1730s

It is no exaggeration to say that the Band is critically acclaimed. They have made a number of recordings which are often to be heard on Radio 3 and Classic FM. Early Music Review has described their plaving 'mouthwatering in its simple quality of musicianship'. Those of us lucky enough to be in the audience would also undoubtedly agree with a Radio 3 reviewer who described their music as 'deliciously spiced, infectiously musical'. We are very grateful to the Band for continuing to entertain us in Bealings, now that they are famous and have such busy schedules. We were very appreciative to be placed between an interview on Radio 3 the day before the concert and a performance the following evening at St John's Smith Square.

But their work is not just confined to concerts. The Band is also involved in education and community projects. They have commissioned composer Matthew King and librettist Alasdair Middleton to write a community piece. It is the culmination of a 3 year education project, 'Getting a Handle on Handel' which has worked with primary aged children and adults in 2 contrasting settings. The piece explores the theme of town and country using Handel's works as inspiration.

The children have created texts reflecting their environments, one urban (Haringey, London), one rural (Bealings, Suffolk). They have collected sound samples, recording some of the noises mentioned in the texts, and created

musical ideas that will be woven into the completed piece.

NOTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 3rd March Public Participation

A resident from Little Bealings made a presentation to Councillors regarding his plans for a parcel of land he has purchased in Great Bealings.

REPORT BY DISTRICT COUNCILLOR TONY FRYATT

Cllr Fryatt reported that the consultation on Site Allocations and Area Specific Policies finished on 27th February. He has been appointed as Chairman of SALC and is currently involved in two initiatives – (i) affordable housing and (ii) a drive to get local listing of valuable assets. The Community Infrastructure Levy will not now come into operation until the end of June instead of April.

POLICE REPORT

The police report showed no crimes in January

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Charles Barrington reported following a meeting on 2nd March, the Working Group hoped to aive Councillors draft а οf the Neighbourhood Plan along with a presentation at the joint meeting on 16th March. If accepted, the draft plan will go SCDC officers so that discussions with them can commence. It is hoped to make a formal submission by the end of the summer with a view to holding the referendum in the autumn.

PLANNING

The Parish Council discussed the proposal raised at the Public Participation session and resolved to register their views in a letter to SCDC

HIGHWAYS

The Clerk had received confirmation from SCC that the matters last reported would be attended to but was advised that the culverts in Boot Street have still not been emptied. This will be pursued. (NB. This work has now been done)
There is a problem with the drain on the corner of Lodge Road and Lower Street; it is not coping with the spring. This will

be reported to SCC.

FINANCE

Speedwatch – a request has been received for an annual fee of £25 to cover the cost of the triennial recalibration of the camera. This was agreed for this year but is subject to review for future years.

Notes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 2 March 2015

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN COUNCIL MEETINGS

Future Parish Council Agendas will include a 'Public Participation' item. This will be minuted in summary, without including the names of members of the public who raise matters with the Council. It is intended that this session will last for a maximum of 15 minutes. It will be separate from the consideration of business by Councillors. Two items were raised by the public on 2 March:

- Future of the Admiral's Head
- Planning application by Truck R Us for a new headquarters at Kesgrave Quarry

PLANNING

DC/14/4251/FUL: Erection of a new headquarters building for vehicle hire operator (Truck R Us) comprising workshop, offices, associated parking, drainage infrastructure and landscaping to allow for the hire, storage, workshop and sales of vehicles and machinery

It was agreed that Dr Rowe would attend the SCDC Development Management Committee meeting which would determine this application, to present the Council's objection on the grounds of the lack of a noise

assessment and the likely increase in traffic along Playford Road.

EAST ANGLIAN OFFSHORE WINDFARM 1

Pre-construction site surveys would take place soon. It was agreed to request that the existing vehicular access into the field from Holly Lane was used and that no new access be created where the verge had been flattened near the junction with Holly Close.

HIGHWAYS

20 mph SPEED LIMIT FOR THE STREET

County Councillor Peter Bellfield advised that it seemed unlikely that The Street would meet the criteria for this, but the '20's plenty' initiative did have potential. Mrs Wilson will attend the next residents' '20's plenty' meeting on behalf of the Council.

SAVID

It was noted that this safer village driving group would launch officially in June. At present no one was available to attend meetings on behalf of the Council.

FOOTPATH CUTTING FOR 2015

It was agreed to participate in this scheme again, whereby the Council undertook responsibility for surface cutting, funded by SCC. Mr Ball had confirmed that he would be able to carry out the cutting again in 2015.

POLICE

A report from PSCO Sally Thomas explained her visit to Bealings School to advise on parking and road safety. She would visit again in March. The possibility of high visibility vests for the children would be explored.

Mrs Cornish was appointed as the Council's representative on the '12PT' police liaison group.

PUBLIC SEWER FOR THE STREET

Anglian Water had rejected the request for a mains sewer, on the grounds that new private sewers would be more cost effective. It was noted that the residents could appeal the decision to

the Environment Agency.

COMMUNITY EMERGENCY PLAN

Dr Rowe would explore the creation of a joint plan with Gt Bealings on behalf of the Council. Anyone interested in helping to prepare the plan, or helping in the event of a local emergency, is asked to contact the Clerk.

FINANCE

Income of £9 had been received from Gt Bealings as 50% of the premium for insurance of the shared wooden village sian. Cheques were signed for the Clerk's salary, PAYE, hire of the Village Hall for the last year for meetings and the annual Data Protection registration fee. It was agreed to make donations of £25 each at the annual meeting in May to two charities which had confirmed they were active in the parish: Headway and Age UK.

DATES OF FUTURE MEETINGS

The next scheduled meeting will be the Annual Parish Council Meeting to be held on 11 May. This will be immediately preceded by the Annual Parish Meeting.

ACTION POINT REVIEW

Two new yellow grit bins have at last been installed in Butts Road. Repairs to Byway19 will be started as soon as conditions permit. We are awaiting a report from SCC on the repair of the bridle path sign on C324 opp. Church Road and the clearance of undergrowth on FP no. 20 but it is hoped that both will be done in the Spring. The unregistered FP between C330 and U3311 to the north of the village is still

being discussed. A footpath sign at junction of Bransons Lane and Butts Road needs repairs – this has been reported.

See Action log appended to the full mminutes on the website for more details of these items.

COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

County Councillor, Peter Bellfield sent his apologies for absence but is about to undergo an operation. He will be out of action for a while but hopes to be contactable by phone for any pressing problems.

DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

District Councillor, Steven Hudson reported that council tax is to remain at the same level for the 5th year running although Police element will rise by a very small amount. He has procured funds from the Enabling Communities Budget to help with providing a hard surface for the new basketball area in Playford, which we hope will be installed this year. Steven is not standing at the forthcoming elections in May 2015.

POLICE REPORT

PCSO Sally Thomas sent apologies for her absence. There are no reported crimes in Playford for January or February but there are warnings of a scam in Beccles where an elderly lady was targeted by fraudsters recently posing as bank officials requesting her PIN and bank details.

See Police report appended to the full minutes on the website.

FINANCE

£1,500.00 was transferred to the NS&I savings account and payments were authorised for the annual donation to the Benefice magazine and for the Clerk's expenses. It was decided to add Tim Llewellyn as a signatory to the NS&I account.

RISK ASSESSMENT

This has been finalised and will appear on the website shortly along with the Financial Risk Assessment update.

ELECTIONS MAY 2015

There are several potential candidates to be approached and it is hoped we may be able to bring the number of councillors back to the full complement of seven. Election date is 7th May 2015.

OTHER MATTERS

An outdoor meeting will be held to decide the final location of the proposed basketball facilities on the playing field and to measure up for the extra hard-standing to be provided from the Enabling Communities Budget.

The village sign has been returned and is ready to be installed on top of the notice board – it was suggested that a wooden canopy could be erected over the sign to minimise further weather damage.

Since re-painting the railings over the river bridge is proving too expensive to achieve in the short term, a working party will be arranged at the next meeting to remove vegetation and to generally tidy up around the bridge to improve the appearance.

The village phone box, kindly cleaned earlier this year, has been found to be not working and BT has been contacted.

It has been asked why planning sanctions imposed on applications granted in the village, are not always followed up despite being reported to SCDC planning dept. The Dist. Councillor has stated that planning

enforcement procedures are currently being reviewed.

Builders working at the Sevenoaks site have been parking at the village hall as there is no space on the roads nearby – there have subsequently been several complaints about lack of space in the car park. The council has now received a gratuity payment from the builders and it is hoped that the building project will soon be completed.
