# THE PROPOSED CARLFORD AND BEALINGS GROUP MINISTRY: VISIT OF BISHOP NIGEL

In the summer of 2010 joint benefice meetings were held between Otley, Swilland, Clopton, Ashbocking, Burgh, Boulge, Hasketon, Grundisburgh, Great & Little Bealings, Playford & Culpho. It was agreed that the Otley and Grundisburgh benefices would formally join together to become the Carlford benefice and at the same time the Bealings benefice would join with them to create a new Group Ministry. Our 4 parishes will be independent of the Carlford 8 parishes and remain under my care. It does mean though that we can share resources and support each other where necessary. The first stage of the legal paperwork, which has to be signed by the Bishop, the parishes and the Queen, is with your PCC's now. But the sharing of resources has already started. The 5 priests in the area presented a joint Lent course earlier this year, and every time I am off duty they officiate at your services.

There is an exciting time ahead starting with a joint service for all 12 parishes on January 15<sup>th</sup> at 11am in Grundisburgh Church. Do please try and make it, as this will be the first occasion on which the proposed Carlford & Bealings Group Ministry come together to worship. You will be pleased to know that our benefice choir will be joining with the other choirs and singing for the service of Holy Communion.

# THE MEDIEVAL MIND: ART TREASURES FROM EAST ANGLIA - 12 January 2012

Philip Wise will give an illustrated talk exploring the ideas and beliefs of people in the Middle Ages through the marvellous variety of art objects they left behind. Amongst the treasures considered are the prayer book of Anne Withipool whose son built Christchurch Mansion, and the pectoral cross of the last abbot of Colchester, Thomas Beche, who was executed for his faith in 1539. Philip Wise is an archaeologist and Heritage Manager with Colchester and Ipswich Museum Service. He curated the Medieval Treasures exhibition at Colchester Castle Museum.

Both events are Presented at Museum Street Methodist Church (entrance in Black Horse Lane), Ipswich from 1.00 - 1.50pm and organised by Ipswich Arts Association. Admission free but with a retiring collection to defray expenses.

With a witty and well-informed talk, she told of starting her career in journalism in 1990 and outlined some of the pitfalls of the job — in particular, dictation. "Kirton" instead of "curtain" could make a world of difference. Apart from her regular articles Lynne, with her husband, form a team

writing many a script for local pantomimes, often taking part in the production itself.

#### BEALINGS WI PRESS REPORT NOVEMBER 2011

There was excellent attendance at Bealings WI's November meeting when business was swiftly dealt with including the AGM, with Mrs. B. Slim re-elected President. Members learned of a satisfactory financial statement and a report of the year's activities.

The speaker was Mr. Reg Snook, a local wildlife artist, portrait painter and a man of many, many talents. Brought up in Ipswich and educated at Northgate School, when "watch the artist work" was sound advice. From a line strung across the hall to represent a gamekeeper's gibbet, were pegged lifelike hand painted cut-outs of predators which were once controlled and now numbers are greatly increased. The crow family, birds of prey, mink, foxes, rats, cats and uncontrolled dogs, with jays and lesser black backed gulls being the worst predators. Mr. Snook believes these are responsible for the serious decline in song birds. There were numerous questions and members were able to see examples of Mr. Snook's work and copies of his latest book.

A very enjoyable and thought provoking evening.

#### **MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES**

Boot Street Project - Mrs Sally Johnson and her team of helpers have been working hard to get the corner of Grundisburgh Road looking tidy. The land will be rotavated in the coming weeks and treated with weed killer before the winter sets in; planting will commence in the Spring.

#### CO-OPTION

The Chairman welcomed Mr Craig Robertson who was co-opted as a new Councillor to the Great Bealings Parish Council.

# CONSULTATION ON WIND FARM — EAST ANGLIA ONE OFF SHORE WIND FARM: ON SHORE CABLE ROUTE OPTIONS.

Mr Philip Watkins explained that Scottish Power is planning an off shore wind farm 43 km's off the coast of Suffok. This wind farm is going to be 6,000 square kilometres and the mainland connection will go to a sub-station at Bramford. They are looking examining potential routes for the export cables (which will be underground). Great Bealings is in the possible "search area". The preferred "corridor" will be confirmed in February 2012. For more information on this project please look at the website

# DESIGNATION OF SINKS PIT AS CONTAMINATED LAND

SCDC officers attended to advise about this recent designation. SCDC intends to work with SCC, the site owners, to quantify the risk posed by the site as a result of its use as a landfill site for waste by SCDC and IBC before 1974. Surveying and testing has shown the presence of landfill gas (methane) and leachate. Once the risk is quantified, monitoring and mitigation will be put in place. ## COMMUNITY WIND TURBINE FOR BEALINGS VILLAGE HALL

It was noted that the VHMC had not had the opportunity to discuss the matter fully but that there was no support for a wind turbine in the Parish Plan. The VHMC would be informed that the Council has no intension of pursuing the matter any further.

#### POLICE

PC Wright reported that there had been two reported crimes in the parish during October: thefts of heating oil. The police were dealing with rogue traders and thefts of metal, especially copper wire and roof lead. PC Wright asked that suspicious vans be reported and drew attention to the Suffolk Trading Standards website:

<u>TradingStandards/</u> and the availability of 'no cold calling' posters. It was agreed to investigate establishing a 'no cold calling zone'.

#### COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH SCHEME

Further consideration would be given to joining or setting up a scheme once new data in respect of traffic speeds on Martlesham Road and information on how the scheme operated was supplied by the police. County Councillor Bellfield had indicated that funding for equipment may be available from his Locality budget next year.

#### **HIGHWAYS**

Mr Ball had cut part of FP18, between the railway line and the old piggeries, for a third time in the season following a complaint to SCC. SCC had agreed that, assuming there was still funding, the cost could be added to the cutting schedule for 2012.

SCC had been advised of concern about the erosion of the bank between the Church and Holly Lane and the exposure of tree roots. The problem was considered to be the result of the steepness of the bank, weather erosion and use of the bank by school children passing to and from Bealings School and Bealings Village Hall car park.

## PARISH PLAN OR NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANNING?

District Councillor Tony Fryatt confirmed that SCDC's LDF and its policies would be in place before any proposed National Planning Policy Framework was operative. However, there was still concern that the presumption in favour of sustainable development proposed by the NPPF meant that, unless there were relevant policies in place, Little Bealings could be vulnerable to more development than current policies and guidance permitted.

The production of a Neighbourhood Plan, as opposed to an update of the Parish Plan, would be more effective in controlling development in the parish, as the latter would be subject to scrutiny by an Inspector and would then become planning policy. As such it would be a relevant document in the determination of future planning applications in the parish.

The cost implication of producing a Neighbourhood Plan was noted, together with information received from Suffolk ACRE on both Parish and

Neighbourhood Planning. It was agreed to invite a representative from Suffolk ACRE to the Council meeting on 9 January 2012 to give further advice.

It was agreed to consider setting up a Working Group to produce an initial draft Plan. Residents who would like to join the Group are asked to contact the Clerk (details below) as soon as possible. Matters to be considered by the Group are likely to include LDF/Local Plan policies as applicable to the parish, the potential for designation of a Conservation Area and the Group's own ideas as to what would be considered appropriate development for Little Bealings.

## Visit to Kesgrave Quarry on 17 October 2011

bealings.suffolk.gov.uk. The visit had been very informative and established useful contacts for any concerns about operations at the site.

#### EAST ANGLIAN OFFSHORE WIND FARM

It was noted that the current cabling proposals included two possible routes through the parish. As well as the route passing between Lt and Gt Bealings north of the Village Hall and along the River Lark valley -. a second corridor was being considered which passed south of Playford Road and across a part of Sinks Pit to Playford. The SCDC Proiect Group considering the proposals would be asked to support the Council's objection to the proposed through Little Bealings, one objection being based on the grounds that the River Lark route is within a Special Landscape Area and the impact of the works would be unacceptably damaging to the environment. There would also be a major impact on an area very close to the main settlement of the village and which was very popular with local and visiting walkers. There would be a long term impact on many properties, including tree planting and future development potential. The Council agreed to join the Suffolk Preservation Society and seek its support for objection to this route.

The Playford Road route also passed extremely close to many properties and in addition involved disturbance of Sinks Pit. The recent designation of Sinks Pit as Contaminated Land by SCDC, meant that disturbance was extremely dangerous. However, if the Playford Road route was moved further from properties and appropriate mitigation works were undertaken for the entire area, there could be merit in a route passing through Sinks Pit which would receive support from the Council.

The SCDC Project Group would also be asked for information about the level of radiation that the cable would produce when operative, in order that a further objection on health grounds could be considered.

#### MOTORBIKES AT SUNFIELD FARM

There was concern by some local residents at the noise generated by motor-bikes at Sunfield Farm on Sundays and it was agreed to investigate the frequency of activity and pursue the matter further with SCDC.

## SECURITY LIGHT AT BEALINGS VILLAGE HALL

It had been established that there was no difficulty with the light being owned by the Council but insured and maintained by the Village Hall. Gt Bealings Parish Council had decided that it would not contribute 50% of the shortfall in funding for the light (£87.32p). The Council noted that the project was an action from the Parish Plan and the data from the Plan showed more support from Gt Bealings residents for the light than from Lt Bealings residents. However, and notwithstanding an offer from a resident from Gt Bealings to fund the shortfall personally if it secured the pro-

ject, it was agreed that the Council would meet 100% of the shortfall in funding, £174.65. It was hoped the light would be installed during December.

#### **FINANCE**

The auditors had completed the audit of the 2010/11 accounts and had not raised any matters which required an 'issues arising' report. The annual return was approved and the notice of conclusion of the audit would be advertised as required.

Mr Carr had attended an SCDC presentation on its budget proposals for 2012/13. In respect of the Council's budget for 2012/13 it was agreed to include a Project Fund of £300 for Neighbourhood Planning and that the precept, which had not been increased in 2011/12, be increased from £5750 to £6000.

Income: The second half of the precept for 2011/12 had been received from SCDC (£2875). The Council had also received SCC P3 funding for 2011 (£160), Gt Bealings PC contribution to half of the insurance premium for the shared wooden village sign (£11.50) and a refund from the Aldeburgh Food and Drink Festival for underpaid postage (£1.22). Cheques were signed for the Clerk's salary and expenses, PAYE and the external audit fee.

## CHANGES TO SCDC WASTE COLLECTIONS

There were concerns from some residents about missed collections and bin replacement following recent changes by SCDC to the collection days. SCDC had apologised for some errors, but stated that collection was difficult in some places and asked for residents to cut trees and hedges to enable the collection vehicle access. SCDC would be asked to replace bins to the sides of driveways to ensure they did not block access to properties for residents' vehicles from the road.

#### CORRESPONDENCE

An invitation had been received for the Chairman and Clerk to attend the Kes-

grave Town Council Annual Reception. The Boundary Commission for England was reviewing parliamentary constituency boundaries, but no change was proposed for the constituency which

included Lt Bealings

#### DATE OF NEXT MEETING

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Friday 2 December to consider a planning application. The next regular meeting of the Council will be on Monday 7 November. The meeting will start at 7.30pm and be held in the Village Hall Committee Room. During the first 15 minutes of all Council meetings the public are welcome to raise any matters of concern with Councillors. The public may also speak for a maximum of 3 minutes on any item on the Agenda at the beginning of that item.

In the period of public discussion it was reported that a copse has been cut down. This had been very much a part of the established landscape. The Parish Council were asked to write to SCDC to ensure this fate does not happen to the 2<sup>nd</sup> and larger copse in the field.

# REPORT BY COUNTY COUNCILLOR PETER BELLFIELD

Mr Bellfield reported that they have appointed a new Chief Executive. Her salary is less than £155,000 (no bonuses). He also reported that all libraries will stay open and that the Highways maintenance department at SCC is to be put out to private contractors. This will take place in 18 month's time.

#### **Highways and Footpaths**

## Footpath between Butts Rd and Church Rd

A letter was written to Mr Parken re the possibility of re-instating a "path" (which is on his land) running between Butts Road and Church Road. No reply has been received to date.

#### Kerbing outside High Meadows

The Chairman reported that Mr Derek Oldham had confirmed he had written to Mr Ashfield, owner of High Meadows, to discuss changes to the kerbing outside High Meadows.

#### Foodbridge, Footpath 23

Highways has replaced the wire meshing at the end of footpath 23. It was agreed to monitor how often the wire would need to be replaced.

#### **Brook Lane Hedge**

The hedge (Cricket Meadow side) down Brook Lane needs cutting back. The Chairman said he will have a chat with Mr Charles Lofts to see if this can be done

#### CORRECTING SAT-NAVS

A link on "Correcting Sat Navs to prevent HGV's using unsuitable roads" allows you to "log" roads unsuitable for HGV's/Wide loaded vehicles. Mrs Joan Metcalfe said she would log Church Lane/Hill Farm Road in the hope that this might deter wide loaded vehicles from using this route.

#### **GRIT BINS**

The locations of the grit bins SCC have on record need to be checked against where the grit piles and bins are in the village. Dr John Day volunteered to check the 10 locations they have on their database for ensuring that grit is deposited in the right place should we have a harsh winter.

#### **BUTTS ROAD HEDGES**

It was reported that the hawthorns/ blackberries on Butts Road need cutting back.

# PLAYING FIELD HEDGE AND PLANTING OF SWEET CHESTNUT TREE

It was resolved to inform SCS that we are happy with his quote to cut back/ trim the hedge and fell the dead tree. It was agreed to advertise the availability of logs (from the tree) for private collection, subject to a donation to Parish Funds. Once the hedge has been trimmed back the Community Payback Team will maintain the hedge. The Sweet Chestnut Tree will be planted in place of the felled tree.

#### THE QUEEN'S DIAMOND JUBILEE

This will be celebrated on the 4<sup>th</sup> June 2011. The Chairman asked for a volunteer to liaise with Mrs Judith Dunnett and her Committee – they have been planning a Street Party. Mrs Joan Metcalfe volunteered. Mrs June Gosling is also on the Committee in her capacity as Village Hall rep.
