

A lbert Schweitzer said "Until he extends the circle of his compassion to all living things, Man will not himself find peace.' It is claimed in the first book of Genesis that God gave us humans dominion over creation. This can also be interpreted as 'stewardship' and implies a sacred duty of care towards every living thing.

St Francis of Assisi was someone who lived out this vision in his life and was ahead of his time in his reverence for the whole of creation. His example is something that has only now been followed since the late 20th century, nearly a millennium after he walked this earth. St Francis, the son of a prosperous cloth merchant, was born Francis Bernadone in 1182 in Assisi, Italy. After a period of illness during which he nearly died, Francis decided on his recovery to dedicate his life to the service of his fellow humans. This went against his wealthy family's wishes, his parents

became angry with him, and his father eventually turned him out of the family home. Francis lived like a beggar in a cave with very little food, relying on those around him for sustenance. He became very attached to the birds and beasts around him and preached the love of God throughout the countryside. He treated the birds and animals as his brothers and sisters and is known as the Patron Saint of animals.

Playford Church is having a "St Francis service", a pet service, on 25th July to which we are inviting people to bring their pets and animals so that they can each receive a blessing. Care and compassion towards all the created order is our responsibility and during this animal service we will pray for guidance and strength that we may follow Francis' example in the way we look after our animals and our planet earth.

Summer is a time to refresh our bodies, minds and spirits after the cold and wet winter. May I take this opportunity to wish you a relaxing summer and space to enjoy those things that usually get pushed out of our lives.

For the purposes of this survey Suffolk County Council are interested in <u>localised rainfall</u>, groundwater and sewer/drainage events only.

If anyone has suffered from these forms of localised flooding would they please let me know as soon as possible since I have to respond to Suffolk County Council by Monday, 19th July 2010. (Any details of flooding events should give location, date and type).

LITTLE BEALINGS

JIM WARD

This is an abridged version of the tribute written by his family and read at Jim Ward's funeral on Friday 4th June. Jim has been a fixture in this village for half a century. He has raised two sons, been a good husband, and a loved granddad. In all that time it is hard to recollect a harsh word or an unkind act.

I suppose that some of us will remember Jim for his involvement in village life. He was a Parish Councillor and Chairman for many years. He was inordinately proud of that first step on the political ladder. Now a man of truly unimagined power and influence, he decided he couldn't stop there, adding membership of the Neighbourhood Watch rapidly to his list of honours. Having both political *and* judicial responsibilities, where could he go next?

By stealth, he was progressively taking over the village. He consolidated his position with secretarial authority at the Carpet Bowls Club and a somewhat spectator role at the Badminton Club. Volunteering at the Sutton Hoo exhibition was an outlet for his love of history. He spent some years delivering library books from Woodbridge Library to the housebound. Perhaps that led him to feel the need for a lasting legacy — a permanent reminder to generations to come. He channelled his life-long talent for art into the Woodbridge and Playford Art Clubs, serving as secretary to the Playford Art Club. He had an unfailing interest in understanding the minutiae of the careers of his offspring, and in using modern computer technologies - he never actually *did* understand either the careers or the computer, but that isn't the point. He had advice to give by the bucketful, mostly unsolicited and around 30 years out of date, but it was proffered with the kindest intentions. He believed in hard work and honesty, and practiced what he preached. He was our moral compass.

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

It was agreed to consider inviting a key note speaker to next year's meeting and improving acoustics.

OPEN WEEKEND IN SUFFOLK

A grant of £100 had been received from SCC towards the Bealings Challenge Cup.

HIGHWAYS

Bealings Road Safety Group: The Group had met with a representative of Suffolk ACRE on 28 April. School parking was much improved and SCC had been asked to re-paint the white line between the Church and Holly Lane. However, the Village Hall Management Committee advised that it could not

sustain the level of extra maintenance needed to the Village Hall car park resulting from its use for school parking. Costings would be obtained for surfacing, marking out and low level lighting and Suffolk ACRE would explore the likelihood of grant funding from the Local Strategic Partnership. The Group would also consider the School Travel Plan.

Church Footpath: A meeting had been held with SCC in view of concerns about the surface of the footpath. A contractor would be asked to cost works, but SCC was unable to confirm that any funding would be provided.

Footpath Cutting: The Parish was participating in the SCC cutting scheme again and George Ball would undertake the work. The routes to be cut would include the verge footpath to the Playing Field. Damage to the bollards on this route had been reported to SCC.

New Permissive Footpath: SCC had opened a new permissive footpath running from Martlesham Road southwards to join to other routes. Plans are on the parish noticeboards. This will enable walkers to cross the A12 using the Martlesham Road bridge.

Road Closures: SCC had been advised that it would be preferable if the closure of Boot Street (14 June – 2 July) and Playford Road (28 June – 9 July) for surface works did not overlap but no reply had been received.

PLANNING

C10/0574: Ascalon, Playford Road – Erection of First Floor Extension over Garage and Single Storey Extension to form Annexe, and Alterations to Existing Vehicular Access (re-submission) This application had been approved by SCDC.

C10/0554: Finches Hill, The Street – Revised: Build enclosed swimming pool and enclosure on land forming part of plot at present listed as use. Change use to domestic for whole site. Build bund no more than 2m high to the north of the enclosure from the spoil excavated from the pool site. This application had been

further revised as permission for change of use was no longer needed, in view of the time the land had been used for residential purposes. It was noted that there would be further plans and discussion between SCDC planning and land-scape officers and the applicants.

C10/1169; Longacre, Playford Road – Erection of Cart Lodge, Store and Home Store. The Council had no objection to this application.

IPSWICH BOROUGH COUNCIL LOCAL DEVELOPMENT FRAMEWORK Core Strategies and Policies. These had been published on 26 March and the parish was included in the IBC policy area.
