s you may be aware Bishop Nigel has for some time had the unenviable task of chairing a working group appointed by the House of Bishops in 2012 to try and find a way forward for the Church of England to allow women to be consecrated as bishops. This month there is a meeting of the General Synod (the governing body of the Church of England), at York to which the working group under the auspices of the House of Bishops will bring the fruits of their work on Monday 8th July. There was a full report of the group's deliberations in the Church Times of 31st May and this is but a synopsis. The motion will request the drafting of new legislation to enable women to be consecrated to the episcopate. If this is passed it will allow time for further debate at the November meeting the General Synod and the process could be concluded in 2015.

If this happens then the Church of England will be fully committed to all orders of ministry being open equally to all, without reference to gender, and will expect that "office holders" (priests and bishops legally appointed) will receive due respect and canonical obedience. This then means that anyone who ministers within the Church of England must be prepared to acknowledge that the Church has reached a clear decision on the matter. The only exception will be where historically the Anglican Church continues to share with other denominations who don't ordain women as bishops, (as I have experienced in Lanzarote where the Anglican Holy Communion service is celebrated in the local Roman Catholic church) and within those provinces of the Anglican Communion who do not ordain women as Priests.

The Bishops acknowledge that the Church of England is at a place where neither side is likely to claim outright victory. There will be many who find the ministry of women, particularly as bishops, unacceptable, but who still wish to remain within the Church. It is envisaged that Pastoral and sacramental provision for this group will be made in a way that maintains the highest possible degree of communication and contributes to mutual flourishing across the whole Church of England. The working group looked at several ways forward, of which they prefer option one. Bishop Nigel is reported as saying "We have a choice of proceeding by grace or by law. As you go down the options, more law goes into it. It seems wise to start with maximum grace and see where that gets us: that's where the House of Bishops would like to start." He went on to say that he hoped people would not start to take positions and sides too soon, "this is a real attempt to see how we can begin to honour each other rather than be suspicious of each other".

Please pray for Bishop Nigel as he carries this heavy load and puts himself in what will surely be the firing line from at least some of the General Synod representatives.

GREAT BEALINGS

ST MARYS

This is going to be a painful exercise. We're just about to go away for a week's holiday so I am having to write these notes on June 4th to meet the deadline, and have to try to anticipate September, as that will be when you receive your next magazine. Not much happens in the next couple of months so circumstances now force me to anticipate the various September events, typically one of our busiest months. So apologies for switching your minds out of early summer mode and towards autumn!

LOOKING BACK PCC MEETING ON JUNE 4TH.

We try to hold our summer meeting in

the vestry, as it's the one time in the year when it is warm enough, and it gives your PCC members a good opportunity to have a close, on-site look at the fabric and state of the churchyard. The main points emerging from the meeting were:

1. We are reviewing our plans for carrying out necessary repairs to the church, as itemized in Quinquennial Inspection Reports. One additional problem has emerged, namely that of re-tiling the roof, as many of the tiles are "shaling" –i.e. breaking up. This will be expensive, so we are adopting a new strategy, one that includes putting together a complete package of repairs so that it can be submitted for one consoli-

dated faculty (i.e. legal permission to do the work). This will be done in conjunction with our architect who will help us prepare the documents. We are also intending to apply to such funding bodies as may be able to help us. Certainly the funds generously raised by The Friends of Great Bealings Church will be a significant contribution to the sums required to complete the work. Fortunately, even with just one single Faculty the work can be carried out in stages, so budgeting will be spread over a period of some five years.

- 2. Various ideas emerged from the recent meeting of local churchwardens. Certainly some could be considered by FOGBS. Amongst the ideas aired were:
 - i A Toy Service –just before Christmas –surplus toys could be passed on to less fortunate children.
 - ii Consider helping out a local Food Bank.
 - iii Use individualized invitation cards for special services.
 - iv Coffee mornings in various houses.
 - v A church quiz night.

If you are enthused by any of these ideas and would like to offer support, do please have a word with a member of the PCC.

3. The PCC were delighted to have had such a positive feed-back from their NADFAS visitors on April 14th. Indeed the success of the Church Recording group and of the special service was featured on the front page of the recent NADFAS Newsletter, with a picture of the presentation of the book later on in the publication.

LOOKING AHEAD

Most major events are linked with FOGBC –see item elsewhere in this Magazine. We can, however, give the date of our Harvest Festival – Sunday September 8th. This, as we understand it, will be the 10th anniversary of Pauline's arrival in our midst, so that is something to celebrate.

FLOODLIGHTS

We can but apologise for recent malfunctioning of the lights. Somehow the lights, when turned on, immediately trip a switch, and they fail to come on. A meeting with an electrician took place on 5th June, and it is hoped that the problem will have been identified and steps taken to remedy it. We do very much value the contributions to church funds made when people celebrate/ commemorate various occasions or loved ones, and understand that this is an important way of doing so in public and in a way which lights up the summer evening sky. Please accept our apologies. Roger Roseboom kindly continues to accept both your messages and your £5 and to ensure that the lights are on. It has been as frustrating for him as for all of us

EAST ANGLIA ONE WINDFARM

Mr Colin Hedgley, Mr Paul Norris and Mr Martin Cripps had attended the presentation by EAOW the previous night. Comments made by Councillors were a) the depot site at Playford is unnecessary but is being used as it will cut EAOW's costs significantly and b) Boot Street will clearly be used by HGV's as it is the shortest route to where the cabling work is being carried out... Councillors decided that they did not need to make any additional comments to the most recent Consultation. Subject to the approval by the Planning Inspectorate the works will commence in 2016.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The Chairman reported that it had been a very busy year with 12 planning applications most of which we have ap-The long awaited Solargen proved. sign has been installed in Boot Street thanks to Mr Paul Norris. Thanks should also go to Mr Robin Sadler for his exploration work for a Community Wind Turbine. An open meeting had been held for residents from Playford. Great and Little Bealings to discuss the location found for the Wind Turbine however this had met with little support from those living within a quarter of a mile of the site. A new site was found but the Parish Council has decided that the best way forward to gauge support for a Community Wind Turbine is to air it under the umbrella of the proposed Neighbourhood Plan. The EAOW planning application has been submitted to the Planning Inspectorate and a new consultation period begun since geological conditions in The Bealings have confirmed that the HDD method will not be suitable and Open Cut trenching will need to be used instead. EAOW shall be presenting on this to the village at the beginning of June. Another major item in the Chairman's Report is that the Parish Council has agreed that we should proceed with the production of a Neighbourhood Plan. SCDC are consulting on this for us and a working group has been set up of which Mr Charles Barrington is the secretary. This Plan will involve many people and a lot of work. Ipswich Borough Council and adjoining District Councils are looking at housing needs in the Eastern Ipswich Fringe possibly an extra 2,500 dwellings over the next 15 years highlighting the need for a Neighbourhood Plan for Great Bealings.

DISTRICT COUNCILLOR TONY FRYATT'S REPORT

Mr Tony Fryatt reported that £100,000 has been earmarked to allow three people to run the Neighbourhhood Plan process at SCDC. He also reported that the number of Councillors at SCDC could be reduced from 55 to 43. Mr Tony Fryatt informed Councillors that there was grant money available at SCDC that could be made available to Parish Councils – "Revenue Grant".

VILLAGE HALL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE'S REPORT DELIVERED BY MRS JENNY SHAW

Mrs Jenny Shaw, Chairman of the Village Hall reported that it costs £8,000 a year to run the Hall and £3,000 a year for the playingfield. Last year costs were kept to a minimum and with the help of Peter Bellfield's locality budget they were able to mark out the car park with blocks to assist tidier parking.

The weather has seriously impacted the lines on the Sports Court and with the support of the Parish Council the release of funds from the Outdoor Playspace Fund which would cover 2/3rds of the cost of having the lines re-painted has been given from the green light. Events planned this year include; an event on the 13th July to celebrate the 5th anniversary of the refurbishment (organised by the Friends of the Field), a New Years Event at the Village Hall on 31st December, and to hold another quiz evening. Mrs Jenny Shaw thanked the volunteers that continue to help and

in particular Mrs Margaret Wilson who is the Secretary, bookings officer and treasurer! Also thanked are Eric Barnett, Robin Sadler and Peter Bellfield. A full copy of this report can be viewed on the website: www.greatbealings.co.uk.

BENEFICE NEWSLETTER TEAM DELIVERED BY MR NORMAN PORTER

Advertisers continue to use Benefice Newsletter and this year there was £1,000 in the bank before they even went to print. On top of that donations from Parish Councils bring the total income up to £1,530 and with outgoings at £1,601 there was just a £71 shortfall. The production of the Magazine is the result of a team effort and a real debt of gratitude is owed to all of the team - contributors, compilers, designer, treasurer, collectors, distributors, and, indeed, readers. The Benefice Newsletter alongside the digital news service provided by Phil Holmes, remain for many, at the heart of good community communications. Also playing a central role in village life is Great Bealings Church - they are looking for a Church Warden. Finally the Farm Fair last September had been a huge success and this event will be repeated this year. The time, energy and expertise of as many villagers as possible will be called upon and with up to 1,000 visitors last vear our village will be very much on show.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN PROGRESS REPORT DELIVERED BY MR CHARLES BARRINGTON

Mr Charles Barrington reported that after 6 months preliminary discussions and meetings the Neighbourhood Plan is now ready to go public and the first consultation stage in in progress (26th April – 21st June 2013). He suggested by way of background that residents and Councillors take a look at the Upper Eden Valley Neighbourhood Plan on the net. It is the only Neighbourhood Plan

in the country to have been passed by a referendum so far and is a very well written document. Mr Barrington reported that SCDC have agreed to increase their planning support budget by £100k to allow more staff to be hired to work on Neighbourhood Plans and he reported that we have also applied for funding from DCLG under a scheme that can grant up to £7k per Plan.

The work has been divided into the following headings; Built Environment, Natural Environment, Consultation Process, Funding, Services and Historic Setting and Context. Mr Eric Barnett is in charge of the Consultation stage with two Open Days scheduled to run on the 14th and 15th June in the Angela Cobbold Hall.

COUNTY COUNCILLOR PETER BELL-FIELD'S REPORT

Mr Peter Bellfield reported that Mark

Bee and Debora Cadman have proved highly successful as political leader and executive leader of the Council for 2012/13. He reported that once again SCDC are on track to achieve the savings of £25 million this year and that Council Tax will remain unchanged. Other items Mr Peter Bellfield reported on were libraries, education, residential care homes, broadband, energy from waste, the fire and rescue service, future back office requirements, records and heritage functions and the proposal of major construction sites. Notes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 10 June 2013

EAST ANGLIAN OFFSHORE WINDFARM CABLING ROUTE AND CONSTRUCTION DEPOT

The Parish Council considered the Supplementary Environmental Information provided by the applicants, which included a Traffic and Transport Assessment, with Outline Plans for Traffic Management (for HGVs), Access Management (for access to the Construction Consolidation Sites (e.g. at Playford)) and Travel (for construction workers). A change to the use of horizontal direct drilling (HDD) to cross Lodge Road was also included, as a result of site survey information. The consultation docuavailable ments are at http:// eastangliaone.eastangliawind.com/ application documents.aspx

The Council resolved that the extra information and the change in respect of the HDD proposal for Lodge Road made no difference to the Council's objection to the routing of the cable through Bealings and its preference for AOA (the northern route) for the cable. The applicants would be requested to

carry out assessment of:

the impact of use of the haul road by construction traffic on current vehicular use of Holly Lane and Lodge Road

noise, vibration and air quality impacts on Holly Lane and Lodge Road, the applicants' assessment of impact on The Street being irrelevant given the location of the cable route and haul road.

The Council would also ask SCDC and SCC to produce a Local Impact Report for Bealings, as referred to by the Planning Inspectorate. The Council had registered to attend the Inspectorate preliminary meeting on 25 June, at which the issues to be addressed and the means by which the Inspectorate would deal with them would be discussed.

The next scheduled meeting of the Parish Council will be at 7.30 pm on Monday 1 July 2013 in the Village Hall Committee Room. During the first 15 minutes of all Council meetings the public are welcome to raise any matters of concern with Councillors. The public may also speak for a maximum of 3 minutes on any item on the Agenda at the beginning of that item.
