Once again I would like to thank all of you who take on parish responsibilities and without whom parish and church life would be the poorer. Many people help throughout the course of a year in each parish, many tasks remaining unseen, until they are not done! It needs to be faced though that every year it is harder to find people to volunteer for jobs which make the difference between your church being open on a regular basis and looking welcoming or not. If you feel that you could offer some time please contact your Churchwarden.

As always we are very grateful to our benefice choir led by Gill Peck. We also thank our organists, Andrew Clarke, Margaret Cotton, Maurice Jones, Jane Hartley and Elaine Strouts. We are very fortunate indeed to be able to enjoy such a high standard of music.

We have faithful Churchwardens, and Elders, who are the eyes and ears of their communities, they help me to keep in touch with the joys and sorrows of community life. During the year Philip Merry one of our Elders was selected to train as a Locally Ordained Priest and ioins Diana, our Reader in ministerial training. During the year our 'Open the Book' team made monthly visits into Bealings School for dramatised bible storytelling assemblies. We have also welcomed children and their families to church services, to our 2 All Age workshops held at Christmas and on Good Friday and to the pre Christmas Posada service in Playford. The annual Crib service which moves around each year continues to break Box Office records. Thank you to all who give their time to involve children in church life

While we have lost some good and loyal friends from our villages during 2011 the

good news is that 3 couples were married in our churches, and 1 person was confirmed.

I am pleased to report that the production of the benefice news seems to be working well, although in 2011 production costs, which are at a minimum, were in excess of income. We are grateful to our Parish Councils, various parish halls and those who advertise, for their patronage. I hope that you enjoy the wide variety of news that the magazine brings each month.

With the help of Jos Saunders and Virginia Porter we ran an autumn course across the benefice called Christianity Explored. 12 people signed up and for 8 sessions had a meal together and studied St Mark's Gospel and what it meant to follow Christ.

We said goodbye to Roger Roseboom, as Great Bealings Treasurer and thanked him for all his work, and welcomed Adrian Melrose in his place. Finance is always a problem; yearly expenditure exceeds yearly income in each of the parishes. This is not due to sloppy housekeeping but to the fact that the Diocese has to pay the costs of their clergy - stipend, housing, pensions and training, funded mainly from parish contributions, the Church of England does not have pots of invested money yielding income. This is a heavy burden leaving very little for keeping body and soul together, never mind the lead on the roof!

The Angela Cobbold Hall continues to be well used. Thanks must go to Peter & Vicki Carr who look after the hall so well and as a bonus provide us with delicious soups in Advent and Lent and cream teas in the summer, with profits going to charity.

Since retiring as Rural Dean in February I have had more time to spend as your parish priest. If you want a visit or a chat please ask. I am always happy to meet you, either in your home or in my office in the Angela Cobbold Hall. Our church communities are delighted to welcome

those who visit our church buildings and churchyards and those who come to services and we pray that in 2012 we still have the resources to keep our churches and churchyards in good order.

BEALINGS WI REPORT FEBRUARY MEETING 2012

On a bright February afternoon when village snowdrops were coming into bloom after wintry weather, members gathered to hear how 17 members and friends enjoyed a day visit to Norwich, then joined in a member's forum to plan summer activities.

The speaker, Mrs. Linda Sexton, gave a fascinating insight of "54 Miles to Yarmouth", the story of the Ipswich to Great Yarmouth Turnpike. She explained that in medieval times the upkeep of roads was the responsibility of the parishes, but with the coming of the Industrial Revolution and the need for better travel and distribution of goods, trusts were set up to run the road systems. Toll gates and houses for gatekeepers were provided and horses made available. From a list of toll charges - drove oxen, cows - 10 pence per score, with calves, sheep, lambs, hogs and swine at 6 pence per score. Pedestrians went free. Milestones were very important; a particularly fine one in Rushmere gives location and distance to London and mileage to Ipswich on one side and the other side gives distance to onward destination. The milestone is clearly marked with the maker's name, J. Garrett, Iron-founder, St. Margaret's lpswich, dated 1818.

ST MARY'S

Our erratic late winter has seen temperatures lurching from the teasingly spring like to the genuinely arctic. There has been quite a lot of hunkering down and getting on with indoor jobs. Not that events in the outside world have made for complacency. It can sometimes be a bit too easy to escape from them and to put them to the back of our minds. That said, the media ensure that we have our fill of Syria, Iran, economic gloom and joblessness. We live in challenging times and, from the relative comfort of our relatively affluent village, need to keep in mind the victims of events which can sometimes seem personally and geographically remote.

LOOKING BACK...... RISING TO THE CHALLENGE

The weather forecasters had been grimly promising us hefty amounts of snow overnight from Saturday 4th to Sunday 5th.February. They were right. We were scheduled to have a 10-00

service, and the omens were that few people would make it. In the event, not only did Pauline, our Priest, make it over from Boyton, but she came to us via the 8-00 Communion Service at Playford. Equally intrepid was Dorothy Yule who had walked all the way up and down the treacherously snowy hill from Grundisburgh Road, despite the conditions. No choir, and quite a lot of improvisation, including an on-the-spot choice of hymns, dependent on which Pauline could play, but the 8 people who managed it enjoyed a service with a difference.

ROSAMOND FIREBRACE

A Celebration of Life Service for Rosamond took place in St Mary's on Saturday 18th February. She was 92. Close on 70 people celebrated in words and music the fullness of her life. Rosamond moved into The Willows, Great Bealings about 6 years ago, from the Wiltshire village of Shalbourne where she had lived since the all-too-early death of her

husband, Anthony. Before that she had lived in Holland and Austria. At the service, her son, James paid tribute to her sense of dignity, her stoicism and above all her ingrained optimism, a characteristic of her generation. In Aden and Alexandria she had picked up some basic Arabic, including the enigmatic 'Bukra fil mishmish'- 'tomorrow in the apricots'. For her this was 'tomorrow will be better, even better. Her uncomplaining optimism stayed with her to the very end, as she continued to defy the medical odds. Her final words were typical Rosamond "I think I've caught a bua".

Those present will remember Rosamond's hand-painted Christmas cards, James' description of her familiar green Peugeot as "a fairground bumper car" – the Willows gates were just a bit too narrow – and for her love of nature.

James concluded with these words of the Second Caliph Omar Al-Khatab, hung in a house in Argyll, where four generations of Rosamond's family had spent some of their happiest childhood years:

There are four things that come not back: The Spoken Word, The Sped Arrow, The Neglected Opportunity, and Al-Haya al-Madhiya, the Past Life.
