ur cathedral church has a new boss! During October The Revd Canon Dr Frances Ward was collated and installed as Dean of the Cathedral. succeeding the Very Reverend Neil Collings who died earlier this year. After Bishop Nigel she is the most senior priest in the Diocese which encompasses most of Suffolk. The service was one full of colour and pomp, with several bishops, many visiting priests and laity including robed Judges and local civic dignitaries. The ceremony was set within the service of Choral Evensong. Dr Ward was escorted into the Cathedral to a triumphant fanfare played on trumpets and organ and presented to the congregation by members of the chapter of Bradford Cathedral where she has been its Canon Theologian since 2006. She was then led up through the Cathedral nave before being presented formally to the Bishop. She then affirmed her belief in the Church of England and its laws, before taking the oaths of allegiance to the Bishop, the Queen (in the form of the Lord Lieutenant of Suffolk) and the Cathedral

She will direct the life and work of the Cathedral and because the Cathedral is

also a parish church she becomes its vicar. Dean Frances has experience of working in a Cathedral environment with special responsibilities for resourcing all aspects of study. Since being ordained she has been a parish priest, worked in a theological college and been a bishop's advisor on Women in Ministry. She was born in Australia but grew up in Ely before going to study for a first degree at St Andrew's University. changing course after a year to study theology and eventually feeling God's call to be a priest. Dean Frances believes that before trying to find the answer to the question of whether God exists, it is important to get into the habit of God, the habit of prayer, of loving your neighbour as yourself and of putting yourself to one side and not being narcissistic. She also believes that it is important to recognise that women can be leaders as well as disciples. "Christ was male, but the God he incarnated was neither male nor female and Christ transcends gender at the altar." It was a joy to be at the service and I am sure that we will be seeing a lot of Dean Frances in the future both in person and in the media

2011 CENSUS

The 2011 Census questionnaire will be coming through your letterbox next spring. On 27 March 2011 all residential households in the United Kingdom will be taking part in a census. Since 1801 (apart from in 1941 during the war) a day has been chosen every ten years for this purpose. The census provides an excellent source of information about the population. This enables central and local government, health authorities and many other organisations to plan housing, education, health and transport services for years to come. The census statistics feed into resource allocation for local authorities and play a major part in their ability to provide local services, so it is crucial the population estimate is as accurate as possible. When the questionnaire envelope comes through the door vou'll easily recognise it by the purple 2011 Census logo. Take care of it. If, like many people, you want to complete the questionnaire online, your individual

internet code is on the front of the questionnaire.

UK YOUTH CLIMATE COALITION

Four years ago to the day I was leaving Suffolk and heading to study International Development at the University of Sussex. Since that fateful day I've learned how climate change is the biggest challenge that my generation faces, and it was during that time that I was inspired to act. For the 18 months since graduating I have been volunteering full time for the UK Youth Climate Coalition (www.ukycc.org). As part of that work I've now been given the opportunity to stand alongside 10 other voung people from around the UK as a member of the UK Youth Delegation to the UN climate negotiations in Cancun. Mexico, this November.

The delegation will join other youth delegations from around the world in Cancun to make sure that decision makers at the UN know that it is our futures they are negotiating with. We will also be reporting back to the UK the personal side of the negotiations, the progress that is made, what decisions are taken, and what they mean for the UK and its young people. But I need your help. Even as one of the directors of the UKYCC I. like all the other delegates, must raise the £1500 needed to cover the costs of our places. GONDOLIERS – IPSWICH G&S ON TOUR!

For the first time in their 80 year history, lpswich Gilbert & Sullivan Society are this year presenting their annual stage show in both Woodbridge and Bury St Edmunds.

The Gondoliers, with words and music by the famous duo WS Gilbert and Arthur Sullivan, marks the Society's 80th anniversary this year as a repeat of the opening show of 1930 - however, this version will be a modern take on the classic operetta; the story remains the same and the well-loved songs and melodies are all there, but you'll find some interesting parallels and up-dated jokes amongst Gilbert's own comedy. The story is set in Venice where two brothers live, Marco and Giuseppe. They are happy being gondoliers until one day an imposing stranger announces they are not, in fact, brothers but that one of them is the only sonand-heir of the late king of Barataria. Precisely which of the brothers is a king and which a gondolier is unfortunately a mystery. It is doubly inconvenient when they discover that the king, whichever he is, was married in infancy to the daughter of a Spanish duke - as only half an hour earlier, the brothers were both married to two local Venetian girls. Being forced to leave their new wives behind, the gondoliers go off to Barataria, set up a republican kingdom, where all are equal, and they reign in a coalition government - but surely this can't go on for ever?

MORE LOCAL ORGANISA-TIONS AWARDED BPF COM-MUNITY GRANTS

The latest round of BPF local community grants brings the total amount awarded to date by the scheme to nearly £15,000 since the Britten—Pears Foundation launched it in 2009. The most recent awards are:

- £2,000 to Aldeburgh Primary School towards a secure outdoor learning environment to meet the needs of the growing numbers of early years pupils;
- £1,000 to Leiston Film Theatre Support Club towards an ambitious project to bring digital 3D movie-going to the district;
- £1,000 to Coldfair Green County Primary School to buy and restore violins for year 2-4 pupils in the school's inclusive and popular violin group;
- £625 towards curtains that are the finishing touch to a major refurbishment achieved by Westleton Village Hall Committee;
- £500 to provide equipment storage for Fromus Croquet Club in Benhall, a new and growing group promoting the sport in the local area.

The grants are easy to apply for, and the next funding round is now open. It closes on 26 November 2010, but the round after that does not close until 29 July 2011.

These BPF grants aim to support the vitality of community life in Aldeburgh and its surrounding villages, especially Orford, Snape and Blythburgh, though the scheme is open to any noncommercial organisation operating within a 20 mile radius of Aldeburgh. Grants are awarded on a one-off basis for specific projects, rather than ongoing running costs.
