One of our organists Andrew Clarke celebrated the completion of the repairs of the organ at Great Bealings by giving a short talk and recital at our Harvest Festival service. Sadly we can't reproduce his wonderful playing but below we have reproduced his equally inspiring talk.

I love the organ! I sometimes joke with my wife "if there aren't any organs in Heaven, I'm not stopping!" I'm sure there will be music of which we can only imagine. As a musician therefore, I want to thank all those in the Benefice and specifically here at Great Bealings for their commitment to the refurbishment of the organ.

As a Christian, it is my hope and prayer that the organ will not only lead and support our worship here, but that its voice will also sound out God's love, power and glory.

You may have noticed on the Sundays when the organ was out of action, all the various pipes and bits and pieces laid out across the back pews here. There are hundreds of pipes, springs and levers inside an instrument like this, and what you can actually see of the pipe work represents just a fraction of what makes up the whole instrument.

The Great Bealings organ is actually three organs in one each played by a separate keyboard or 'manual', two for the hands and one for the feet. It struck me when I was thinking about what I might play and say this morning that we can draw some lessons for ourselves from the refurbishment of the organ.

An organ is made up of many parts, each with a different function and purpose, so too we, as members of God's church, have different functions and purposes.

Some of the pipes in this organ are small enough to be held in your hand.

Others are big and imposing. Some parts are obvious, clear and visible to all, others, including interestingly enough, the most crucial, are never seen. They're hidden out of sight deep inside the organ. Some parts might seem inconsequential, but, if just one small part ceases to function, the whole instrument suffers.

So too, with us. Some have conspicuous tasks to perform in the church; other tasks might be carried out with noone ever getting to hear. Some of us might be tempted to think, what can I do? Surely I don't matter. Or we might be tempted to leave tasks to others, to those we consider more qualified than ourselves. But don't ever think that you are not important in God's eyes, for He has something He wants you to do indeed there are some things that only vou can do. They might seem inconsequential – like some of the hidden parts of the organ – a phone call you've been meaning to make all week, a letter you never got round to replying to, a dispute that really needs settling. Just as the organ has been refurbished, there are times when we too should 'refurbish' our lives, clear out the dusty corners, repair those things that don't function as they should so that our lives are fit places to testify to God's praise and glory.

Years ago organs like this would have been pumped by hand. Nowadays, an electric blower blows air into the organ and, when the stops are pulled and the keys put down, the air gains access to the pipes. You see, an organ is no good unless it's filled with air. In the same way, we, as members of God's church are nothing without the breath of God, without the breath of His Spirit filling our lives and giving us the power and energy to function as we should.

Here is a verse from a favourite hymn of mine. Not only does it have a wonderful, majestic tune composed by Parry, but it has some terrific words too which are based on Psalm 150. This is verse 3:

O Praise ye the Lord, all things that give sound;

Each jubilant chord re-echo around; Loud organs, His glory forth tell in deep tone. And, sweet harp, the story of what He has done.'

May the organ of Great Bealings tell forth all that God has done and is doing here, and speak of His glory and faithfulness to each one of us

Advice from Trading Standards at Suffolk County Council.

Many charities drop flyers through your door offering to collect donated clothing. However there is a worrying trend of bags being removed by unlicensed collectors who are selling on the clothes abroad.

Some bags appear to be from legitimate charities – a logo may be copied or a name used that is similar.to a well-known charitable cause. It is estimated that British charities are losing around £14million per year by this sort of crime. You are encouraged to read the charity bags carefully; - signs that the people you are dealing with are not legitimate are: - a company rather than a charity number, spelling or grammar mistakes, and a mobile number rather than a land-line. Notes from the Little Bealings Parish Council Meeting held on 12 October 2011

NEW PARISH COUNCILLOR

Barnaby Rufford was co-opted to fill the vacancy on the Parish Council.

PI ANNING

National Planning Policy Framework

A response to the government consultation on the draft National Planning Policy Framework was agreed, expressing the Council's strong disagreement with proposals which did not offer sufficient protection to the countryside and which proposed replacing current Planning Policy Statements and Guidance Notes with one document and 'a presumption in favour of sustainable development'. If the Framework was implemented, there would be a need to consider Neighbourhood Planning for the parish to put local polices in place, as provided for by proposals in the Localism Bill.

Applications

C/11/1780 – Firecrest Nursery, Hall Road – Erection of Packing and Plant Preparation Shed

It was noted that SCDC had approved this application.

C/11/2232 – Blewbury, Playford Raod – Erection of first floor extension, one and a half storey rear extension and detached cart lodge/garage.

There was no objection to this proposed development.

EAST ANGLIAN OFFSHORE WIND FARM

Mrs Wilson and Mr Carr had attended a presentation by ScottishPower Renewables: the proposal involved bringing electricity generated off shore to the existing Bramford electricity substation by underground cabling. The search area for the cabling corridor included Little Bealings, with one proposed route running from Great Bealings under the

River Lark, passing north of the Village Hall and across Holly Lane to Playford. More information is available at www.eastangliawind.com and potentially affected residents are being contacted by a survey company, Freedom. There would be further consideration of a response at the next Parish Council meeting.

REVIEW OF ROAD NAMES BY SCDC

A response to SCDC was agreed, highlighting various anomalies and points raised by residents. SCDC would be asked to consult directly with affected residents and landowners before any changes were agreed.

DATE OF NEXT MEETING

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Monday 7 November. The meeting will start at 7.30pm and be held in the Village Hall Committee Room. During the first 15 minutes of all Council meetings the public are welcome to raise any matters of concern with Councillors. The public may also speak for a maximum of 3 minutes on any item on the Agenda at the beginning of that item.

Mr & Mrs John Beech, the owners of Bransons College were in attendance and answered questions about the proposed development. At the end of the question and answer session Councillors unanimously agreed to support the application and write to SCDC informing them of their decision.

Playford Mount, Playford, IP13 6PH Alterations and extensions to facilitate conversion of outbuilding to annexe (existing modern stables to be demolished)

C/11/2097

Playford Mount, Playford, IP13 6PH Resiting of existing stables

Mrs Judith Shelley, the owner of Playford Mount was in attendance and was asked to outline her plans for the house. Once again after a question and answer session Councillors agreed to support the application and inform SCDC of this.

DRAFT NATIONAL PLANNING POLICY FRAMEWORK

The Chairman reported back from the SCDC meeting he had attended on the DNPPF. At that meeting SCDC gave reassurances that the DNPPF is designed so that local planning authorities will have more control on what development takes place by withdrawing inappropriate national planning regulations. SCDC confirmed that the DNPPF was designed to provide protection against wholesale, inappropriate planning. SCDC invited Parish Councils to contribute to the consultation response on the proposals, especially to seek a clearer definition of "sustainable development". Playford Parish Council resolved to contribute to SCDC's consultation in addition to responding to the Government 's consultation directly.
