expect that by now you will have lacksquare caught up with the news that I shall be retiring on 31st December 2013. I am finding that my energy levels are not what they used to be and being nonresident can mean a lot of travelling sometimes 50 + miles in a day, which in itself is tiring. All this means that I am finding it difficult to be your parish priest in the way that I would wish. The average stay of a priest in a parish is somewhere between five and seven years. I have been involved with the parishes of Great & Little Bealings, Playford & Culpho for thirteen years, three as your curate and ten as your priest in charge. During that time I have also acted as Rural Dean for the Woodbridge Deanery and become a Canon of St Edmundsbury Cathedral.

My son with his family has recently moved from Cambridge to Wales to take up a position at Monmouth School, which involves working on a Saturday. This means that if I continue working, even part time I will never see the grandchildren. Families are important and retirement will mean that I will be able to continue to visit regularly and be a grandma who is involved in their lives and not just a name on a card.

Over the last five years my priority has been to train Lay and Ordained church members for ministry. We have three Elders, Alison Baker, Denise Merry and Virginia Porter who lead prayers in church, administer the chalice, and will visit the sick if asked; they can prepare

families for Baptism and provide activities for children inside and outside church. Our newly qualified Reader, Diana Gardiner has a preaching and teaching ministry among you, and is licensed to conduct some services and assist at others. Philip Merry is in his last vear of training to become first a deacon and then a priest, not to take over the parishes, but to provide practical ministry alongside a new parish priest when someone is appointed. We have excellent Churchwardens and PCC office holders and our musical tradition has grown thanks to our organists and choir. All this will leave the parishes in very good heart and able to weather the interregnum. It is now time for someone with another vision to take over. From January 1st practical church questions need to be directed to the parishes details on the front page of this magazine, and for matters relating to ministry such as weddings you will need to approach the Rural Dean Canon Clare Sanders. In 2014 a retired priest, Canon David Lowe, will conduct many of your services and you will be able to meet him if you come to my last service on 29th December in Great Bealings church at 11am.

However until the end of the year which is still three months away I am still your priest and will be happy to hear from you should you wish to contact me. More details concerning the future will be available in the December issue of this newsletter.

We had four cyclists (a brace of Firebraces and 2 Porters) taking to the highways and byways and enjoying the hospitality of the county's open churches. LITTLE BEALINGS PARISH COUNCIL

Notes of the Parish Council Meetings held on 21 August and 9 September 2013

POLICE

There had been six crimes during August: arson, criminal damage and burglary. Three people had been arrested and investigations were ongoing. There was continuing vandalism at the Playing Field and the police were visiting more often. There was a possible theft of a tortoise from a garden.

Bealings School had not agreed to the police visiting and giving road safety advice, but another approach would be made. Parking was currently of concern and the police intended to visit at drop off/pick up times.

Speeding remained a priority for action and three speed checks had been carried out in the parish recently. Penalty tickets had been issued. Due to concern about the speed of traffic in Martlesham Road, speed data would be collected and 'SID' would be used to advise motorists of their speed.

The Council had no objection to organised cycle races passing through the parish.

PUBLIC SEWER FOR THE STREET

As a result of problems raised by some residents, it was agreed to co-ordinate an application to Anglian Water for a public sewer to be provided in The Street. Residents are asked to the Clerk as soon as possible if they wish their property to be included.

PLANNING POLICY

The Council's Planning Statement was reviewed and an updated version agreed. It can be viewed on the Council's website.

STATUS OF THE PARISH

It was agreed to ask SCDC to review the status of the parish as a Local Ser-

vice Centre in the Planning Settlement Hierarchy, on the grounds there were no local employment opportunities and the status of 'Other Village' was therefore appropriate.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

PL\0231\13: Installation and Operation of Small Scale Electricity Generation Plant: Land Adjacent to Sinks Pit, Hall Road

It was agreed to object to this application on the grounds that there was insufficient evidence that the noise levels would be acceptable.

C12/2483: Finches Hill, The Street: Certificate of Lawfulness of Existing Use or Development (CLEUD): For a swimming pool enclosure built under permitted development law previously attached to dwelling but since 02/12/12 not attached

SCDC had refused this application for a Certificate. It was agreed to ask SCDC when enforcement action will take place.

C13/0758 The Dower House, Manor Farm Lane: Erection of first floor side extensions, internal alternations and detached garage

C13/0801 Lime Tree Cottage The Street: Erection of conservatory to side/rear elevation

SCDC had granted permission for these developments.

DC/13/2384/FUL: Marchwood, Martlesham Road – Insertion of dormer windows and rooflights to facilitate provision of first-floor accommodation

It was agreed there was no objection to this application.

Woodcote, Martlesham Road Fernlea, Martlesham Road

SCDC had given permission for works to protected trees at these locations.

FOXHALL STADIUM

It was noted that other parishes did not share local residents' concerns about the noise generated by events at the Stadium. It was agreed to ask SCDC for the Council to be included in consultation about the renewal of the Operating Licence.

HIGHWAYS Exposed Kerb in The Street

SCC had advised that there was no funding for any works and a Safety Audit would not be carried out to assess the status quo. It was agreed to ask SCC to remove the kerbstone.

Trees

It was agreed to ask SCC to consider the condition of the trees each side of the road between the level crossing and the Hall Road crossroads, in view of the amount of ivy on them and the exposed roots.

Sandbox at the Level Crossing

It was presumed that this had been damaged by a vehicle. A replacement would be provided.

FINANCE

The external audit for 2012/13 had been completed and no matters of concern raised by the auditors.

An increase in the Clerk's salary was agreed, in line with the national pay scale. Cheques were signed for the Clerk's salary and expenses, PAYE and for Mr Ball for the annual cutting of the footpaths. Payment of the Council's insurance policy premium was agreed, and there would be consideration that the cover currently provided was appropriate.

An invoice would be raised to SCC for the cost of the annual cutting of footpaths, as agreed. The second half of the precept would be received from SCDC on 30 September.

SAFEGUARDING CHILDREN POLICY

It was agreed that there was currently no need for the Council to have such a policy as events involving children were not arranged by the Council. Mrs Cornish agreed to be the contact point in the event a need for a policy arose.

ELECTORAL REVIEW OF SUFFOLK COASTAL

District Councillor Tony Fryatt advised that it was intended to reduce the number of District Councillors from 55 to 43. It was agreed that it was not appropriate for the Council to be included in either a

Woodbridge or a Kesgrave ward. The Council would respond to the consultation stating that it should be included in a ward comprising Great and Little Bealings, Playford, Culpho and Grundisburgh.

NEXT MEETING

The next scheduled meeting of the Parish Council will be on Monday 4 November 2013. During the first 15 minutes of all Council meetings the public are welcome to raise any matters of concern with Councillors. The public may also speak for a maximum of 3 minutes on any item on the Agenda at the beginning of that item.

PLAYFORD PARISH COUNCIL

These are condensed notes of the proceeding of Playford Parish Council meeting held on 4th Sept. 2013. A full version of the minutes appears on the website: www.playford.org.uk

ACTION POINT REVIEW

There is still confusion with the website situation which is hoped to be resolved quickly with a link from the Playford Village website to the site at OneSuffolk which would deal exclusively with Parish Council matters. A large delivery lorry has struck the trees on Butts Road which were fouling overhead BT cables thus causing emergency measures to

be taken -this has resulted in the BT wires being freed. The footpath from Hill Farm Road to Sandy Lane, Little Bealings has now been cleared of weeds. The two grit bins which were smashed by SCC roadside vergetrimming operations have still not been replaced - Clerk to chase this up. The drainage ditch outside the village hall will be cleared by The Old Parsonage Garden Services when the next grasscutting is due. Building contractors have placed signs at the entrance to Church Lane from Butts Road to assist lorries delivering to the site at Sevenoaks - a further sign is required at the Northern entrance to Church Road to deter HGV's entering - Clerk to contact SCC. The Parish Council is awaiting a decision from the village hall committee regarding an industrial sized bin for recvcling rubbish. Footpaths no/.s 1 and 20 are still badly overgrown with weeds at the Playford entrances - Clerk to chase these.

POLICE REPORT

The Police reported an arson attack at Lux Farm in August which may or may not be connected with similar attacks in neighbouring parishes. The 12PT Monthly Parish Council report states that 3 people are currently on Police bail, pending enquiries.

FINANCE

Cheques were signed for grass & hedge cutting services, tax on Clerk's salary and Clerk's expenses. The remaining balance of the Suffolk Acre grant--, held jointly with Great & Little Bealings was sent to the Bealings Village Hall Trust for the maintenance of the John Belstead Playing Field.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

No objections were raised against DC/13/2224/FUL, the proposed single storey extension at 1 The Courts, Playford and the council resolved to support this application. Planning permission has been granted for the

alterations to Clematis Cottage C13/1152 - work to be commenced within 3 years.

EAST ANGLIA ONE WINDFARM AND CABLE CORRIDOR

The Clerk will attend site visits to view the proposed cable route from the landfall at Bawdsey to the converter station at Bramford. Veronica Bunbury will represent Playford at the Open Hearing on 12th September and also at the Issue Specific Hearing regarding Traffic & Transport on 25th September. Joan Metcalfe will attend the Hearing on Socio-economic issues on 26th September.

OUTDOOR PLAYSPACE SCHEME

Favourite choice for funds available is an outdoor aluminium table tennis table. Joan Metcalfe will investigate further details and the Parish Hall committee will be consulted if it is decided to proceed with this venture.

POSSIBLE REDUCTION OF NUMBER OF COUNCILLORS

The council has been unable to fill the two vacancies so far and it was resolved to operate with 5 councillors for the time being.

OTHER MATTERS

A Safeguarding Policy has been adopted by the council. The proposed Electoral Review of Suffolk Coastal was noted. Donations have been received to cover the cost of the retirement gift of flowers to June Gosling. Dissatisfaction has been expressed with the confusion over the website issues and the fact that the Councillors' Register of Interests is not up to date; the Clerk has the latter in hand.
