REPORT TO PLAYFORD PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 3rd JULY 2014

CRIME UPDATE

Please see June's 12PT report for crime figures.

However, specific figures for Playford since the last parish council meeting are as below.

Since the last Parish Council meeting on 7th May 2014 a total of 13 crimes have been recorded in the parish:

Burglary dwelling x 2
Burglary other building x 8
Theft from motor vehicle x 2
Interference with a motor vehicle

8 of these 13 crimes (61.5%) involved insecurity of some kind.

The same period the year before saw 1 recorded crime.

The increase in crime in the parish is part of a wider trend in the Suffolk Coastal area, which has seen a spike in burglary and theft from motor vehicle offences recently. Suffolk Constabulary is taking proactive action to address these issues, and as well as the on-going investigation of each offence and the trend as a whole, taskings are in place to ensure increased patrols of the relevant areas take place at the relevant times.

SNT CURRENT PRIORITIES

The current three local priorities, which were agreed at the 12PT meeting on 11th June, are:

Priority 1: Tackling anti-social behaviour in the area of Peart Grove, Kesgrave (IP5

2FY).

Priority 2: Tackling anti-social behaviour in the Broadlands Plaza area, Tower Hall and

the Sandlings open space, Rushmere St Andrew (IP4 5SU).

Priority 3: Monitor the speeding of vehicles on roads within the Kesgrave SNT, including

villages within the district (IP5 and IP6).

The next PCEM will be held on Wednesday 9th July 2014 at 6.30pm at Parish Rooms, Felixstowe Road, Martlehsam.
